<p style="text-align: right;">Day 8</p> <p>Luke 4:14–37</p> <p>Jesus goes public with His purpose and immediately encounters opposition.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Day 9</p> <p>Luke 6:17–49</p> <p>Jesus teaches basic truths about attitudes, true charity, evaluating others, and making wise choices.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Day 10</p> <p>Luke 9:18–36</p> <p>Jesus talks with His followers about who He is.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Day 11</p> <p>Luke 22:1–24:53</p> <p>Jesus is betrayed, judged, executed, buried, resurrected, and reconnected with His followers.</p>
